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OUR PUPIL VOICE GROUPS

Some of our children may have come home with a badge! This is because we have been very busy voting for representatives from each of our classes for the following Pupil Voice Groups:

School Council—They help to make decisions about how the school is run and take on projects that support the children's learning and development, such as organising charity events, representing the school at outside events or ensuring the school is environmentally friendly.

Eco/Fairtrade Committee—They take a lead in showing an awareness and a responsibility of the importance of caring for environmental, sustainable issues in our school and Global World. They make positive decisions to improve sustainable development.

Criw Cymraeg—Their role is to motivate and encourage pupils to speak Welsh regularly, both inside and outside the classroom. They help to promote the Welsh ethos at WCIWPS.

Worship Leaders—They play a vital role in the Christian life of the school by organising, planning, leading and evaluating prayer and worship.

Digital Leaders—They support the use and further the development of ICT in school.

Wellbeing Warriors—We believe that the wellbeing of everyone in our school community is important for our happiness and good mental health. Our Wellbeing Warriors are dedicated to supporting the wellbeing of their peers and our school environment.

Cost of Living Action Team—During a period of time when the cost of everyday essentials like food and bills are increasing, this team works together to promote awareness of strategies to support our families.

Enterprise—It gives our children the opportunity to develop entrepreneurial skills in a fun and interactive way.

Young Carers—A young carer is someone aged 25 and under who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support. Our Young Carers group raises awareness and supports our Young Carers in school.

Super Ambassadors—They make sure other pupils know about children's rights under the UNCRC and complete special missions for the Children's Commissioner in school. These have a real impact on children's rights in Wales.

Sports Ambassadors—Their role is to increase participation and healthy lifestyles in school, to be an advocate for sports and provide a young person's voice on PE and sports in school.
