Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to



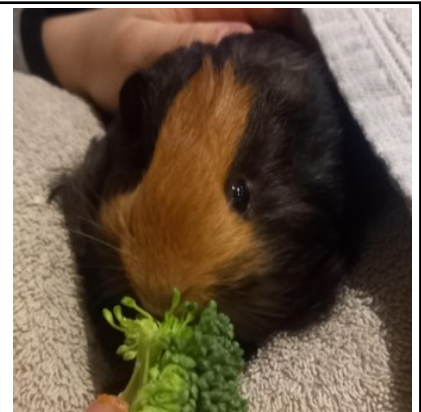
