Risk	Hazard	Who might be harmed	Existing measures to control risks
KISK			
Open gates	Losing children	Children	Staffs check to ensure boundary gates are locked and secure before children go outside.
Low branches	Injury, e.g. cuts, bruising	Staff and children	Staffs check trees and foliage to ensure they are safe. If there is any risk it is reported to HT or Council so that risk can be removed.
Plants, etc	 Poisoning Skin irritation 	Staff and children	Any plants, etc are checked to make sure they are harmless.
Animal faeces	 Poisoning Skin irritation Infection 	Staff and children	Staffs carry out a daily check to ensure area is not contaminated. If it is, protective gloves are worn and faeces are put into a plastic bag and safely disposed of. Hands are washed to prevent infection.
Large apparatus	Injury due to falling	Children	Staff continually supervise children whilst on apparatus.

Risk	Hazard	Who might be harmed	Existing measures to control risks
Water on floor	Slipping	Staff and children	Children are encouraged to be careful when washing hands to avoid spillage. If spillage is minor it is wiped with an absorbent cloth. If major, area is partitioned off, water mopped up and left until area is dry. Use wet water caution sign when necessary.
Cleaning fluids	1. Poisoning 2. Skin irritation	Staff and children	All cleaning fluids are kept in a high cupboard in the toilet area away from the reach of children. Staff follow cleaning procedures that comply with Environmental Health requirements.
Hygiene	Cross infection	Staff and children	Toilets are cleaned at the end of every day. Staff wear protective gloves/aprons when toileting/changing nappies. Staff follow hygiene reminders found in toilet area. Staff follow good hygiene procedures that comply with Environmental Health requirements.

Uncovered plug sockets	Electrocution	Children	Socket covers are placed over any unused socket. Sockets are turned off when not in use. Majority are out of reach of children. Children are made aware of risk.
Loose wiring	Tripping	Staff and children	All wires are adequately guarded and/or out of reach of children.
Microwave and toaster	Injury, e.g. burns	Staff and children	Staff follow equipment safety instructions and appliances are supervised at all times by a member of staff. Snack is prepared in kitchen area away from the children.

Spillages	Slipping	Staff and children	If spillage is minor it is wiped with an absorbent cloth. If major, area is partitioned off and spillage mopped up. Area is partitioned off until area is dry. Use wet water caution sign when necessary.
Paint and glue consumption	Poisoning	Children	At least one member of staff supervises activities to ensure children do not eat paint or glue. Paints and glues are only purchased from regulated sources.
Scissors	Cuts	Children	At least one member of staff supervises safe usage of scissors so children do not cut themselves.

Spillages	Slipping	Staff and children	If spillage is minor it is wiped with an absorbent cloth. If major, area is partitioned off and mopped up. Area is partitioned off until area is dry. Use wet water caution sign when necessary.
Food preparation	 Cross contamination Allergic reactions Knives 	Staff and children	 Food is prepared in a separate kitchen area. A Food and Hygiene policy is followed by staff members. Up-to-date records of allergies are kept and staff are made aware of them. Knives are kept in a box in a cupboard away from children when not in use. Children do not use them.
Washing up liquid and cleaning fluids	 Poisoning Skin irritation 	Staff and children	Washing up liquid is kept on a high shelf away from children's reach. All cleaning fluids are kept in a high cupboard in the toilet area away from children.
