After reading, have a go at answering the questions. What is special about this poem? Last Monday, 25th January, it was Saint Dwynwen's day, or in Welsh, "Diwrnod Santes Dwynwen". This week we will be taking a look at this story as well as the legend of "Gelert". <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>→ Listen to Miss Parry reading the story of Santes Dwynwen and then complete some of the activities.</li> <li>→ Create an acrostic poem all about love! You can use one of the templates below or create your own. Santes Dwynwen is the Welsh saint of lovers, so challenge yourself to include some Welsh words in their too!</li> <li>→ Listen to another famous story, the legend of "Gelert" read by Miss Parry.</li> <li>→ It's over to you! Can you create your own Welsh legend/myth/story that you could tell your family and friends? <b>Tuesday</b>  Remember to read and complete the Sumdog tasks today!	Using the planning template on Google Classroom, you will need to think of events that happen in each season throughout the year. You will need to think of some 'awesome adjectives' too!	<b>Home Hunt:</b> Find bottles/containers in your home and look at the labels to find out their capacity. <b>Wednesday</b>  Remember to read and complete the Sumdog tasks today!	Today, you will become a poet and write your own poem about the four seasons of the year. You will find lots of support for this activity on today's assignment.	<b>My Favourite Drink:</b> Show us how to make your chosen drink, providing the measurements of liquids needed. Take a photo of yourself enjoying your tasty drink and record the recipe!  Adding and subtracting volumes using both litres and millilitres. A worksheet for converting litres into millilitres and vice versa with video instructions from the teacher.	
<b>Thursday</b>  Remember to read and complete the Sumdog tasks today!	It is time for you to perform your poem! You could do this via Flipgrid or you could read your poem aloud to somebody at home. Enjoy!	Create a magic potion! The task will be to create a creepy concoction using household liquids, food colouring etc to conjure up terrible magic potions. Use old plastic bottles, which can be decorated with glitter, cut out stars etc. Things like leaves, sticks etc could be added. Take a picture of the hideous potion and upload it with instructions describing the volume of liquids needed to recreate it. Supervision needed!
